




PCKC Rescue Report 1/30/2022 Cathleen Powell, Rescue Chair

Several Keeshonden popped up in rescue in all corners of Washington in January...just none of them with PCKC. Just so you know, when I am notified I always verify that the dog is in no danger of euthanasia and that the shelter is No Kill. WA shelters are moving to a No-Kill/Live Release rate of 90+ percent by 2025 and very few shelters euthanize "for space" or "time is up" any longer. By the time a rescued dog is posted as adoptable it has usually been vetted at the expense of the shelter, personality and rehoming needs assessed, groomed, and often spends time in foster care. With that sort of monetary and time investment, it makes sense to me that the shelter would prefer to do its own placement. You can find their availability shared on the PCKC and Mount Hood Facebook pages and I try to share this information with people who have contacted me wanting a rescued kees.

I always reach out to the shelters to let them know that PCKC Rescue is available if they are unable to place, as well as Craigslist listings to rehome. Most of the dogs that have come into rescue in recent years have come from Craigslist (or networking) with only two that I can think of being shelter transfers and that was 6+ years ago. The fact that there are so few dogs in the NW in rescue speaks to our wonderful legacy breeders doing an excellent job with their puppy buyers and rehoming their older pups.



Spinning Keeshond fur into yarn

Mrs. Fry of the Isle of Wight originally answered an ad placed by Lady Waechter seeking a home in the country for two Keeshonden rescued during the London raids of World War II. It being the war, when wool for knitting was scarce and expensive, Mrs. Fry began to experiment with spinning the coats of her new pets Andy and Ferdie into a thick yarn. It proved warm and water resistant, and Mrs. Fry's husband developed



an electric wheel so she could improve her production rates from 1 to 10 ounces an hour. She later performed demonstrations for womens' institutes and professional clubs, and was featured in the newspapers, television, and even the funny pages with her dog fur-spun wool. Mrs. Fry, who spread awareness of the breed far and wide, is pictured here in hat and coat made with wool from the dogs pictured. Though her friend is accompanied by a Great Pyrenees, she too is wearing a coat spun from her Keeshonen.
