Precautions regarding atypical Canine Infectious Respiratory Disease Complex (aCIRDC)

Canine Infectious Respiratory Disease Complex (aCIRDC) is currently present in the State of Washington with 16 cases statewide. Washington State Department of Agriculture has cautioned dog owners to be concerned, but urged dog owners not to be "overly concerned". Recommendations for dog owners from the WSDA (list edited for the purpose of the Fun Day gathering) include:

- Dogs are best protected if vaccinated and boosted for all canine respiratory diseases (Bordetella, Adenovirus type 2, parainfluenza combined with the injectable influenza H3N2 vaccine).
- Bring your own water bowl to avoid dogs drinking from a communal water source.
- People should wash or sanitize their hands after handling dogs.

Keep sick animal(s) home unless any of the symptoms below have been absent for at least two weeks prior to the get-together.

Symptoms: harsh, dry coughing fits that have not gotten better after a week or so, wet cough, retching and gagging, loss of appetite, sneezing, nasal or eye discharge, red eyes, lethargy, trouble breathing (especially from the stomach), blue or purple gums.

Spinning Keeshond fur into yarn

Mrs. Fry of the Isle of Wight originally answered an ad placed by Lady Waechter seeking a home in the country for two Keeshonden rescued during the London raids of World War II. It being the war, when wool for knitting was scarce and expensive, Mrs. Fry began to experiment with spinning the coats of her new pets Andy and Ferdie into a thick yarn. It proved warm and water resistant, and Mrs. Fry's husband developed



an electric wheel so she could improve her production rates from 1 to 10 ounces an hour. She later performed demonstrations for womens' institutes and professional clubs, and was featured in the newspapers, television, and even the funny pages with her dog fur-spun wool. Mrs. Fry, who spread awareness of the breed far and wide, is pictured here in hat and coat made with wool from the dogs pictured. Though her friend is accompanied by a Great Pyrenees, she too is wearing a coat spun from her Keeshonen.
